Anwar Kawadri: a passionate Syrian film Producer/Director/Writer. He produced films such as *The Serpent of Death* and *Nutcracker*.

Samah Bushra: originally a refugee from Sudan, is an inspired individual that volunteers in Lesbos and Athens.
